Also there was Kent Shackelford - Director of Financial Accountability and Chapter Support Team Lead, Greg Morgan - Director of Leadership Programs and CHOICES Facilitator, and David Baars - Director of Expansion/Team Lead.

Mike Greenburg was the Conference Facilitator and lead each

of the Chapter's there through exercising in which they discovered ways in which to improve their chapters and clearly defined their vision statement.

Eta Iota has set out to work on developing better accountability and respect amongst themselves and the Brothers, improving upon attendance and ambition, and staying consistent with the values for which Sigma Chi represents. Their vision statement is that Eta Iota consists of "Enduring Leaders Promoting Respect, Accountability, and Philanthropy to better our Brotherhood and Community."

Jeremiah Poff, Eta Iota's Conference Chair, put in many

months of planning and was a huge reason that this conference was such a success. 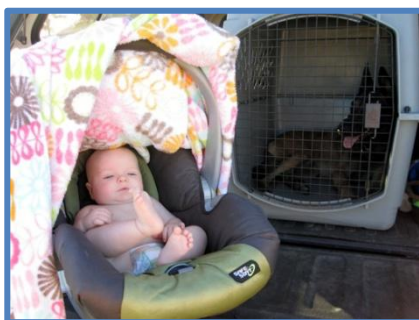
