the university. We'll know more in the coming months after this process gets underway but basically we are making a commitment to participate in this "alumni housing council" and contribute to this initial analysis over the next year or so. The details of what this proposal will contain are yet to be determined but will likely outline each group's current financial position, future housing needs, and the benefits to the university in moving forward with such a plan. For example, Mike dug up the fact that Greeks at ERAU comprise only 6% of the alumni population but contribute somewhere in the neighborhood of 40% of annual donations...pretty amazing. We've got some major influence within our organizations and we desperately need this consolidated effort if we are to get the ultimate vision underway anytime soon.

The meeting also updated the groups on the options of where a future Greek Row may be planned. While this is obviously not a complete analysis, here is the latest of the pre-preliminary info:

Option 1 – Behind the Field House. This has long been a top contender because of its location and close proximity to the university. The land is currently undeveloped and serves as a buffer between the field house and the residents living behind it. The main opposition to this option has been a group of elderly residents who made their intentions clear that they would prevent this from becoming university property at all costs. These residents have since moved across Bellevue Ave and checked into a much quieter neighborhood.

Option 2 – South Clyde Morris. A recent survey done on this property currently owned by the university shows that it is contaminated much more than anyone ever expected. While nobody is saying exactly what was found, this plot was previously owned by a waste management organization that allegedly did plenty of dumping in the area. Besides the

obvious drawbacks, this land would be prohibitively expensive to develop and is not located contiguous to campus.

Option 3 – Chanute Complex. It was originally thought that this land would be available sometime soon and be available for use. The university has recently decided to keep this as apartment housing for at least 10 years. Even if this land were to be available within our timeframe, it would require razing the current buildings and would probably not provide enough space for all of the organizations. This property is also the furthest from campus of the three.

We'll look into each of these options in the coming years and have more information on the proposal at 30<sup>th</sup>.
