-CURRENT PROJECTS-

The existing fire alarm at 520 South Ridgewood has been inoperative for about 4 years now. House Corp reviewed proposals from 3 contractors and has selected Giles Electric of Daytona Beach to update and return the system to working order.

The cost for the work is estimated at \$2,800 and will involve replacing all 25 smoke detectors with new units by ESL. These new detectors should simplify future maintenance with the following features:

• Central Fault Monitoring – The new detectors will have self-diagnostic features that periodically test the system every few seconds. If a detector is unplugged or the sensitivity falls below a certain limit, a fault indicator in the library will suggest to check the rooms. A flashing light on the guilty detector will indicate which room is causing the problem.

• Replaceable Sensors – A major problem with the current system is that the detectors were not easily cleaned. We were forced to replace the whole thing at about \$100 when they caused false alarms (and we could only guess which ones were causing the alarm). The new units have a replaceable cylinder that will allow the House Manager to simply replace a minor part when sensitivity becomes a problem due to dust, about an \$8 part.

Giles is expected to complete this work shortly, making the house overall considerably safer.

The roof of the main house was recently replaced for about \$4,000. Several leaks had sprung over the last year and Hurricane Floyd of '99 pretty much killed our previous roof after years of abuse – both Mother Nature and active brothers. The active chapter has taken action to minimize any future damage from unauthorized access to the roof. The shingles on the wings were replaced back in '94 and are expected to last at least another 8 years.

As the actives continue to fill the rooms with full-size refrigerators and entertainment centers, some of the house's electrical wiring has shown its limitations. Overloads were frequent over the past several years, especially in the wings where the wiring hadn't been touched in past renovations.

To fix this, additional circuits were added with new wiring so that every room in both wings would be on an independent circuit. This seems to have solved the problem but has cost the House Corporation about \$3,000.

There have not been any updates on a Greek Row at ERAU. The last we heard was not in the immediate future but we will keep you updated.
