### -TREASURER UPDATE-

From the Office of the House Corp Treasurer (okay, the corner of a spare bedroom where I keep all my crap):

The Good News:

This year's budget seems to be right on target. Halfway through the year and we are 48% into the maintenance budget. There is still some scheduled work to be done at good ol' 520 S. Ridgewood. An interior designer is being brought in to spruce up the kitchen and some door replacements are in the works. Without any unforeseen expenses, we should be able to head into the next year with a surplus in our general operating account. The 1855 Club is still going strong, as our long-term savings has grown approximately 20%. Keep in mind how important these ongoing contributions are to the House Corp. These monies are dedicated for strategic savings for that inevitable time in the future when we need to completely overhaul the current house, build a new house or move. It is important that these funds are in place so that we can be proactive in our decisionmaking and not have to be forced into a situation.

The other initiative we are heading up is the effort to 'straighten out' our books and officially become a tax-exempt organization. Proper filings are yet another requirement we need to have in place if we as a Corporation are to obtain financing in the future.

#### The Not so good news:

We are currently working on the budget for the 2003-04 school year.

As stated above, we will enter the new year with a modest surplus in our general operating account.

Of course, if all things stayed the same, we would be in good shape again with the expected income from rent, the expenses of mortgage, insurance and maintenance. However, as we all know, things will not stay the same:

If we were to impose a 2% increase in rent, we would still expect to fall short for the year by approximately \$7000. The

RMF insurance premiums have increased drastically over recent years and we are again being told to project an estimated 50-70% increase. Most likely, some of this money will come from the Active Chapter and some from the House Corp general operating account to help offset this increase. However, looking ahead to 2004-05, there will be no surplus in the operating account and without dipping into long-term savings, the Active Chapter could see a rent increase of 20% to cover rising insurance costs.

The cornerstone of this situation is obviously our insurance expenses for the coming year(s). We, along with many other House Corporations, are looking for ways to curb these increases and get back to reasonable rates. We will keep you posted on any new developments with our finances or with the ongoing insurance roller coaster.

### -ETA IOTA SCHOLARSHIPS-

Last year, Brother Ryan Donley tragically entered The Chapter Eternal after losing the battle with Leukemia. At the time of Ryan's hospitalization, he was without medical insurance and it appeared that his widow, Past Eta Iota Chapter Sweetheart Daphne Donley and Ryan's parents, Chris and Margie, would be forced to bear the tremendous burden of the intensive care unit expenses. As is customary among our Order, the call went out to generate the financial support for Daphne, Chris, and Margie should other options fall short in providing for their needs.  $\Sigma Xs$ ,  $A \Xi \Delta s$  (Daphne's sorority), ERAU students, and even ERAU Trustees, donated money to support the Donleys.

Fortunately, Florida Medicare was able to cover the medical bills. So the question was posed by Daphne to Eta lota House Corporation members, "What should I do with the money that was donated by such caring individuals?" Brian Lojko discussed options with Daphne, and subsequently with South Florida Province Grand Praetor, Julio "Dances with Porkchops" Varela. After conducting some research regarding the pros and cons of each option, and explaining the information to Chris and Daphne, the Donleys decided to create The Ryan Donley Memorial Scholarship Fund. The Fund will be maintained by The Sigma Chi Foundation, and administered by the Eta lota House Corporation.

Each year, a deserving Eta lota Undergraduate Aeronautical Science student will be awarded a grant to help offset educational expenses. The first scholarship grant will be presented by Chris and Margie Donley at Eta lota's  $32^{nd}$  Birthday Party, March  $21^{st} - 23^{rd}$ , 2003.

#### -HOUSING AND ALUMNI PROGRAMS-

The Eta lota House Corporation has taken on two important missions that will come to maturity over the next four to six months. The first is the development of a strategic plan for housing the undergraduate brothers, and the second is the execution of a new alumni program that will allow our distinguished alumni brothers to Relive the Spirit of Youth and Strengthen the Bonds of Sigma Chi Brotherhood.

While we are <u>not</u> currently in a position to make a decision with regard to the future of Eta lota's housing, we are, however, actively gathering all of the information required to make a decision in the not-so-distant future. We intend to be the masters of our destiny, and to do so requires comprehensive, systematic planning, and the continued financial support through your generous contributions to all of our programs.

Over the past six months The Eta lota House Corporation has investigated housing opportunities that range from on-campus housing to construction of a new building. The House Corporation has enlisted the services of local Sigma Chi alumni Tom Hart and Dwight Selby. Tom is a highly respected attorney, and Dwight is the most successful commercial real estate agent in Volusia County. They often work together on commercial real estate projects and were kind enough to meet with Brian Lojko at the beginning of August 2002.

The first step taken was to conduct a rough order of magnitude estimate of the costs associated with renovating the existing property and subsequently estimate the costs associated with construction of new property. New property could theoretically be developed with or without the cooperation of The University. The second step was to outline at a very high level the logistics required for any major construction activities. The final two steps included a survey of the county zoning maps in order to identify potential land acquisition opportunities and a discussion of real estate development projects in close proximity to 520 South Ridgewood and the impact they may have on our property value. In order to develop a complete picture of our housing situation, separate House Corporation discussions were held internally regarding The University's current development plans and what future support they may provide Eta lota and ERAU Greeks in general.

At a Board of Directors meeting held on Saturday, November 23rd, 2002, it was decided to create a strategic housing plan to be presented to The House Corporation Board of Trustees at a future date. A decision will be made at this time regarding the direction we intend to take for the future of Eta lota. This is an ambitious schedule, but one that must be undertaken if we are to continue to successfully provide housing for the undergraduates and to be leaders at ERAU.

So ends the discussion of The House Corporation's housing plans. As for the new alumni programs, it's a little thing John and Brian like to call...
